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# Activity 1 : Infographic/map "Frais de scolarité pour les étudiants dans l'Union européenne"

<u>Objective:</u> to talk/raise awareness about the EU countries (review of names) and to compare tuition fees (practice of comparisons...)

<u>Materials:</u> infographic/map in color + sentences to translate

### The Activity (about 45min-1h):

- Give out the maps (they have to be in color, so I had a set laminated)
- Give the map a title in English (ex: Tuition Fees in the EU)
- Ask them: what do you notice, what can you compare, etc. = group discussion
- After the discussion, hand out sentences to translate

<u>Note:</u> I used this activity with other activities I do on the EU (see Swap Shop 2015, or send me an email)

## **Activity 2**: Book Reports

<u>Objective:</u> to read a book in English (and to realize that it's not that hard to do!) and to write a short book report

Materials: a collection of "readers" (abridged version books) in the library + a book report sheet

#### **The Activity** (3 weeks, on their own time):

In S1, each 1<sup>st</sup> year student has to choose a book to read, either a short "reader" from the library or a book they choose/buy on their own. It can be a book they've already read in French but not something they've already read in English. I encourage stronger students to read a full-length book. They have 3 weeks to read the book and to write their book report (a short summary + their opinion of the book). The report is marked and counts for 20% of their S1 mark.

<u>Reactions:</u> The students discover they can read a book in English, it isn't that hard, reading in general maybe isn't that bad, they'd like to read more, etc. It's 95% positive feedback!
