

Pair Work en « cascade »

« A » talks to « B » who then talks to another « A ».

Activité pratique pour faire parler des étudiants quand le groupe est un peu nombreux et pour faire coopérer des étudiants de niveaux de langue différents.

- Le professeur choisi un thème ou une vidéo assez courte ou un article assez court (par exemple : une info récente, une « fake news », une nouvelle technologie etc.)
+ vérifie que les étudiants disposent des mots clé pour en parler (à l'aide d'un brainstorming ou d'une fiche de travail par exemple)
- A chaque étudiant est attribué la lettre A (étudiants les plus à l'aise à l'oral ou ayant un niveau convenable) ou la lettre B (autres étudiants ayant un peu plus de difficultés).
On peut par exemple distribuer un petit carré de papier couleur à chaque étudiant : une couleur pour « A » et une autre couleur pour « B ».

Etape 1

Un étudiant « A » rapporte à un étudiant « B » ce qu'il a compris / ce qu'il a à dire sur le sujet. « B » est attentif, prend éventuellement quelques notes pour enrichir sa propre compréhension du sujet et son vocabulaire.

NB : le professeur peut imposer le choix du premier partenaire... ou pas.

Etape 2

Chaque étudiant « B » choisit dans la classe un autre partenaire « A » et à son tour rapporte tout ce qu'il a compris / mémorisé. Puis « A » complète éventuellement ce compte-rendu.

On peut poursuivre l'activité avec une étape 3 et une étape 4, chaque étudiant changeant de partenaire à chaque nouvelle étape et utilisant ce qu'il a appris de l'autre pour enrichir son « rapport » à l'étudiant suivant, ou ajouter son opinion / sa critique si le cas s'y prête.

Dernière étape

On demande à 1 étudiant « B » puis à un étudiant « A » de rapporter ce qui a été compris du document à toute la classe.

OU : on fait rédiger un petit compte-rendu par chaque dernière paire d'étudiants, compte-rendu que l'on peut faire ensuite lire à une autre paire pour correction / commentaires.
