

Samsung Tab Active 2 review

If basic tablets are too delicate for your line of work, **rejoice!** Samsung's new 8 inch Galaxy Tab Active 2 is made for you. With a rugged design **featuring** a non-skid rubber bumper all the way around this durable Android tablet is **made** for **outdoor** and **construction** type **environments**. I'm Erin for tech gadgets Canada.com and I've reviewed Samsung's Android tablets before, so I'm not gonna spend a lot of time on the system and the apps itself. What I'll do is focus on what makes this one different in particular and that is its ruggedized design. In addition to the special rubberized wrap on this tablet the device can survive **drops** of up to **a meter and a half**. Ouch! This device passed United States military testing which **puts it through** 10 **specific** tests including **drops from nearly 5 feet**, **extreme temperatures**, **dust**, **shock**, **vibration** and **low pressure** and **high altitude** testing. My tests of this are not going to be quite so extreme but hopefully it'll give you an idea, here goes...The Tab Active 2 is water and dust resistant and it and the S Pen are both IP68 rated, that means it can **stand up** to the kind of **dirty**, **tough** work **field engineers** face in the field. Not to mention **accidental spills** in the **office** or **at home**. This tablet is IP68 rated and what that means is you **can submerge it in up to a meter and a half of water for up to 30 minutes**. The Tab Active 2 can also withstand extreme temperatures. This tablet has **11 hours of battery life** and you can replace the battery which is backwards compatible with the **previous** Tab Active. It also **comes with the special stylus or the S Pen**. There's **several security options** for how you can access the tablet; you can choose from **fingerprint recognition** **facial recognition** or **pin** or **pattern access**. Some **special sensors** have been **built into**

this tablet: there's a **gyroscope** and **geomagnetic sensors** which are said to help folks like field engineers with site inspections or virtual training. Working in logistics or

supply? The improved **camera** and **barcode reading abilities** and an **NFC sensor** mean you can **scan products, ID cards** and more. The Galaxy Tab Active 2's specs look like

this: there's 3 **gigabytes** of RAM and a **1.6 gigahertz (GHz) Octa-core processor** that's powerful enough to speed up usage when **performing multiple tasks** like **real-time data management** or **onboard navigation**. It can also **handle Augmented Reality applications**

and it **runs** Android 7.1 **Nougat**. The tablet comes with the **standard apps** like **email, calendar** or **web browser** in the **G suite of Google productivity** tools plus **Word** and **Excel**

too. Of course other apps can be downloaded from the Google Play Store. This tablet

has the **Samsung S Pen built-in** and it's **stashed** in a dedicated and very secure **slot** here on the top of the tablet. It's handy for those of us who prefer the feel of writing or who would rather use a stylus for inputting things into forms. I tried the S Pen out

previously with the Samsung Tab S3 using it to write on the screen is **surprisingly**

comfortable and if you've ever used a stylus on a glass screen before, you know it can

feel kind of weird but in this case the Pens contact but the **screen feels much more**

natural almost as if you **were putting pen to paper**. The **photos and videos** taken with

this device are **vibrant** and **detailed** and they're definitely what we've come to expect

from **Samsung who make great cameras a priority** in all their devices. Overall, this tablet is rugged and definitely built for those who need durability in their tech. If that's

you and you're **looking for** an Android tablet for what you do for a living, you're going to be pretty pleased with the Tab Active 2.
